### **CLUB SCRAPBOOK AWARD RULES**

Club scrapbooks entered in this Contest are the winners, or in the case where the winner is unable to compete, the runner-up of the respective contests held at the District level. The District Governor shall submit the name of the District winner and runner up to the MD19 Contests and Awards Chairperson and the MD19 Office within 30 days of his/her District Spring Conference.

This is to be a scrapbook of the <u>CURRENT YEAR'S ACTIVITIES</u>, not a club history book. Previous year's material can be added to a Club History Book, but SHALL NOT be submitted with the current year's Scrapbook for the contest.

There are two categories for the Club Scrapbook: Traditional and Non-Traditional (any form of digital media). The same rules will apply for both scrapbooks. Lions Clubs may enter both contests.

#### 1. JUDGING WILL BE BASED ON:

a. 5 points for each of the following; (Max. 10 possible points)

Entries must be clearly identified on cover with:

- The Club's name:
- The District and Zone of the Club:
- > The fiscal year the Scrapbook was completed and
- The name of the Lion/Lioness/Leo who compiled the scrapbook ON THE INSIDE OF THE FRONT COVER.

The first activity depicted in the scrapbook must be the Installation of Incoming Officers. A title page may precede the pictures of the first activity. Scrapbooks can be presented either in the three sections (divisions) listed below or in chronological order. An index section / page must be located in the back of the scrapbook presented in three (3) divisions: Service Activities; Social Activities and Public Relations.

Points will also be awarded as follows: 100 Maximum points

- b. 20 maximum points General Appearance
- c. 5 maximum points for Service Activities
- d. 5 maximum points Social Activities
- e. 5 maximum points Club PR (See Rule 2a)
- f. 20 maximum points on Cover Requirements (See 1a)
- g. 5 maximum points for Index Page(s) presented in three (3) divisions: Service Activities: Social Activities and PR
- h. 15 maximum points for building of vital Lionism. Does the scrapbook boost the club and all worthwhile activities that it does? Does it do a good job of promoting?
- i. 15 maximum points for increasing Lion's goodwill and strength. Is the scrapbook truly democratic in depicting many members? Does it add to the club fun and camaraderie? Is the fun kept within sufficient bounds so as to avoid real mental injury to any Lion? Does the scrapbook reflect a positive image for the club?

## **CLUB SCRAPBOOK AWARD RULES continued**

#### 2. SCRAPBOOK'S CONTENTS:

- a. A maximum of 5 points each can be awarded for newspaper and magazine print material supported by:
- Any and all photographs and memorabilia of service activities, social activities, thank-you letters to speakers and city officials, programs, brochures, etc. Examples of various types of Lions Days and activities and any other information pertinent to one's Lions Club year.

#### 3. TURNING IN AND PICKING UP OF ENTRIES:

- a. Entries must be delivered to the Convention MD19 Office in the headquarters hotel or convention center by Friday 9:00 AM. The Contests and Awards Committee will pick up the submitted entries at that time for judging. Late entries will not be judged
- b. Clubs are responsible for delivering their entries and picking them up by the final session of the convention.
- c. The Multiple District Office will NOT be responsible for entries not claimed by the final session of the Convention.

THREE COMPETENT JUDGES ARE TO BE APPOINTED BY THE CONTESTS AND AWARDS COMMITTEE. At the time of judging, a check-list based on the requirements listed in the Contests and Awards Book will be provided each judge for each entry. A sheet will be left in each Club Scrapbook with a compilation of the judges' scores for the club's information.
